Perhaps we will be able to expand the opportunity to other grades as well for I believe they have programs to deliver in the junior school as well.

By now, many classes have been to the Life Education Van. The programs the service delivers is universally recognised as supporting healthy life skills and habits and teaches children about their bodies and how to keep safe.
