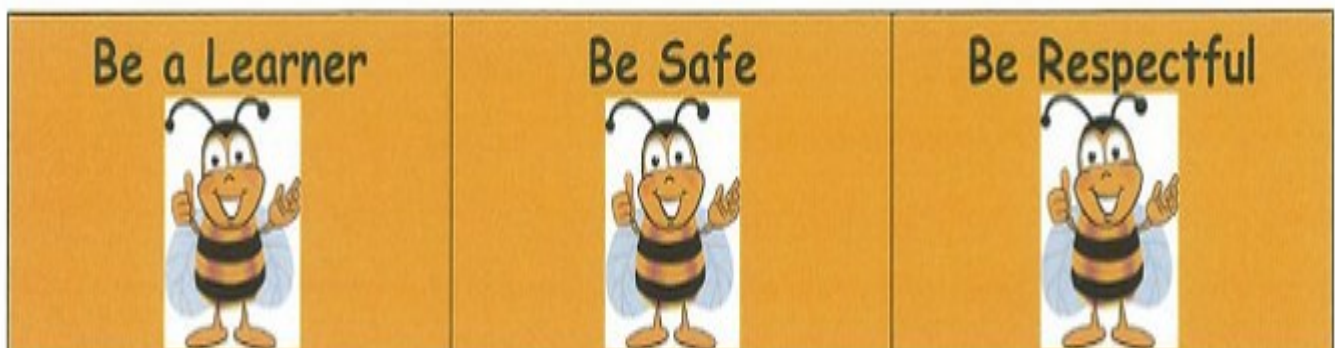

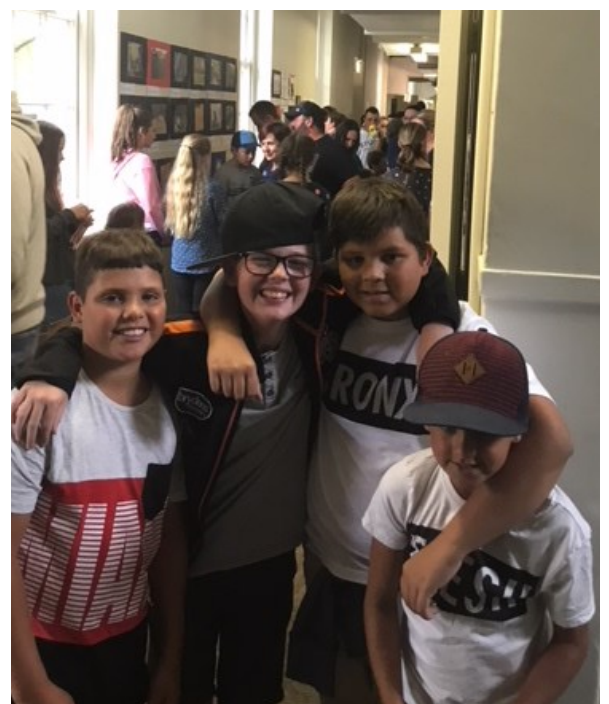

5/6KB Art Program

Throughout the Year 5/6BK have been doing an art program in partnership with the Art Gallery of NSW and the Western Plains Cultural Centre. The program is called Ngu-ng-gila-nha which means give to each other.

The students in 5/6BK have learnt about 3 Wiradjuri artists - Tommy McRae, Michael Riley and Johnathon Jones. They explored where the artists were from, what their artworks were like and what inspired them to draw, paint or photograph. They were able to do a virtual tour of the Gallery of NSW and they had an excursion to the Western Plains Cultural Centre to do an art workshop. The students then created their own artworks based on these concepts.

Last Saturday these artworks were hung in an exhibition and a number of the students from 5/6BK went to the official opening. Malaki, Jack, Brock, Matthew and Nathaniel were able to see their work, be welcomed by the WPCC and have afternoon tea (tea and scones) with the other school children from Dubbo, that also did the program. Mrs Kiss and Kara reported that they were all on their best behaviour and behaved in a manner that would have made our School very proud. The exhibition will be on at the WPCC on Wingewarra St for the next month and then it will be placed in a shop front in Wellington for you all to see.
